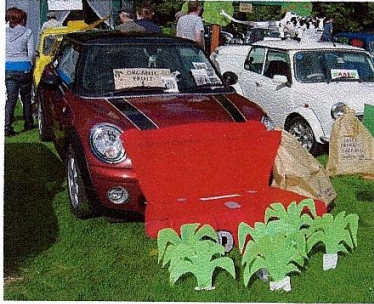

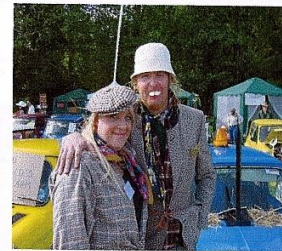
Finally, I would like to give a big thank-you to all of the members, partners and friends who took the time to get into the spirit of things and get dressed up for the show . . . here are a few
